Progress/Updates:

- Kelly N. reports that BCBH held 3 Lunch and Learn sessions, screening The Ripple Effect. BCBH staff also added suicide awareness and prevention information to their email signatures.
- Maureen Hawk reports that all BCRC staff train annually in Suicide Awareness. The Ripple Effect
 has been seen at the BCRC office and Aurora; will continue to screen it until all staff have seen it.
 BCRC staff keep crisis cards in all vehicles, by their phones and on their website. They've also
 generated a list of local community resources for the people they serve.
- Marcy CRS, reported an error message when submitting the Organizational Self Study on the Zero Suicide Website. Diane Flick from PHN, indicated getting a similar result. It was suggested that anyone may still need to complete the self-study for their agency, complete the paper version.
- Discussion was held on how agencies developed their workgroups to complete the Organizational Self Study and roll out the Zero Suicide toolkit.
